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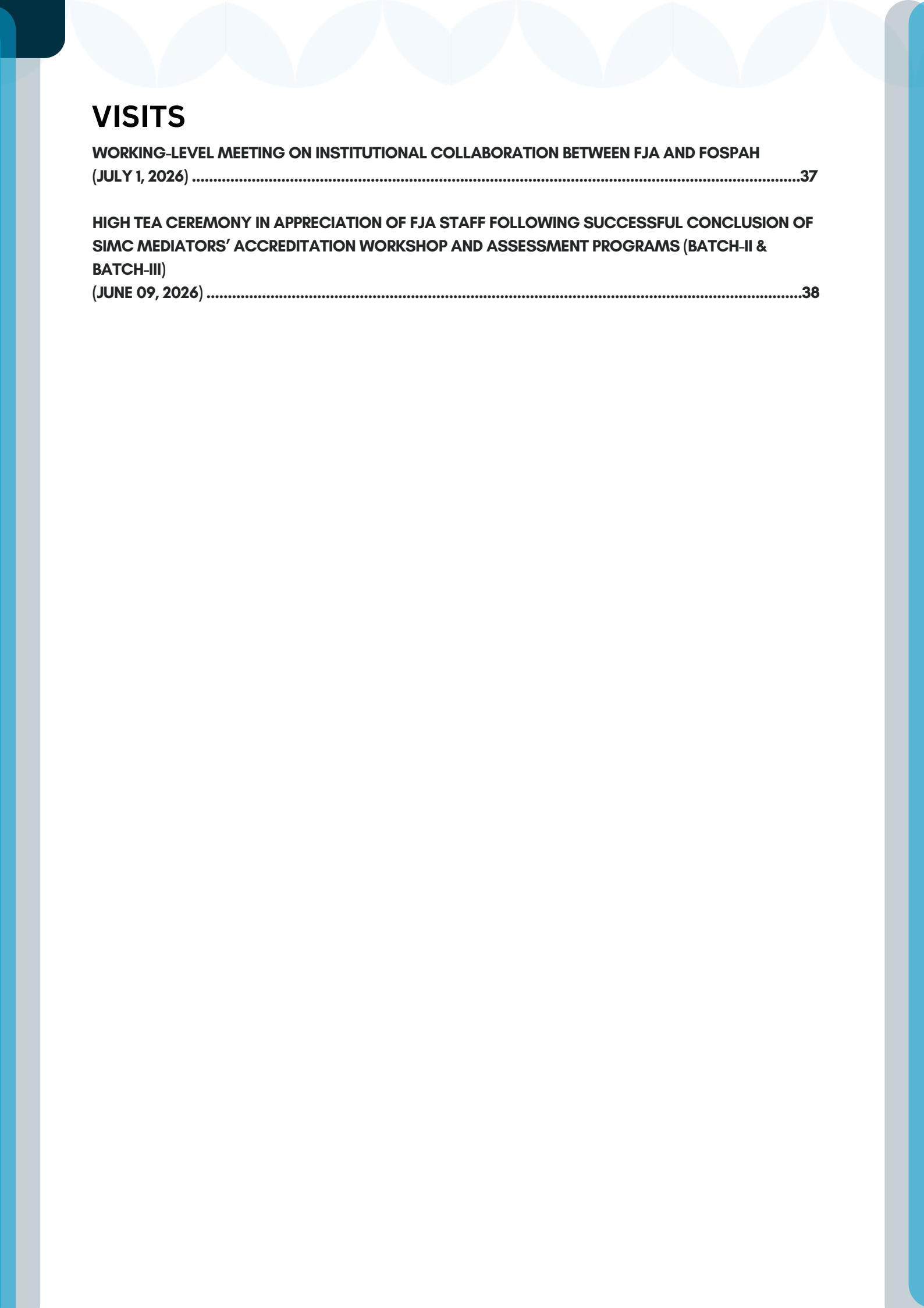
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1-Three-Month Research Cycle-III on “Balancing National Security and Fundamental Humanitarian Rights: Judicial Treatment of Detainees in Violence-Affected Areas” for Civil Judges (April 15–July 15, 2026)

FJA, Islamabad — From April 15 to July 15, 2026, FJA conducted Research Cycle-III on “Balancing National Security and Fundamental Humanitarian Rights: Judicial Treatment of Detainees in Violence-Affected Areas” for Civil Judges from all over Pakistan.

The FJA in collaboration with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), has launched its third Research Cycle focused on “Balancing National Security and Fundamental Humanitarian Rights and Judicial Treatment of Detainees in Violence-Affected Areas.” Bringing together judges from across Pakistan, Gilgit-Baltistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir, the initiative begins with intensive training in contemporary legal research methodologies, followed by a three-month period of structured academic engagement designed to strengthen judicial capacity.

The program emphasize harmonizing Pakistan’s domestic security frameworks with International Human Rights Law (IHRL) and International Humanitarian Law (IHL) to effectively safeguard detainee rights. Through collaborative analytical exercises, participants critically examine complex scenarios to develop actionable judicial guidelines. This rigorous cycle will culminate in a comprehensive research report, reaffirming the FJA’s commitment to advancing informed, research-based and rights-compliant adjudication within Pakistan’s evolving security landscape.

8-Training of Trainers (ToT) for Development of National Pool of Master Trainers Organized in Collaboration with UNICEF under Reimagine Justice for Children (RJ4C) Project (May 04-07, 2026)

17-Three-Day Court Annexed Mediation Workshop for Judges of Islamabad District Judiciary/Court Coordinators organized in collaboration with CLDP (June 16-18, 2026)

FJA, Islamabad — From June 16 to June 18, 2026, FJA in collaboration with the Commercial Law Development Program (CLDP) of the U.S. Department of Commerce, hosted a specialized "Three-Day Court Annexed Mediation Workshop" tailored for judges and court coordinators serving across the Islamabad District Judiciary.

Designed to divert commercial and civil disputes away from traditional litigation, the workshop centered on strengthening non-adversarial resolution frameworks and operationalizing court-connected mediation centers. Key sessions examined core interest-based negotiation tactics, active listening styles, ethical standards for court-appointed neutrals and protocols for converting mediated settlement agreements into enforceable judicial decrees.

Leveraging practical case simulations, procedural mock sessions and direct guidance from international ADR specialists, participants sharpened their dispute management techniques and court referral coordination skills. 18-Seminar on “Gender Responsive Justice” organized in collaboration with UN-Women for Judges of the District Judiciary (June 17, 2026)

Organized by the Law & Justice Commission of Pakistan in collaboration with the Institute of Architects Pakistan (Rawalpindi-Islamabad Chapter), the initiative advances the National Judicial Policy Making Committee’s Gender-Responsive Justice (2026–2027) Reform Agenda.
